#### HOLY CROSS NON-SMOKING POLICY 2008 - 2009

Holy Cross students in **all grades** are prohibited from smoking or being in possession of tobacco or tobacco products at **Holy Cross this September**. The school and the **KFIA Health Unit** will also be offering the **Quit 4 Life** smoking cessation classes in **2008-09**. Students who choose to break this rule will face suspension and a system of progressive discipline for failure to comply with the school's expectation.

#### GRADE TWELVE GALA VOCAL CONCERT

#### GRADE NINE EQAO ASSESSMENT OF MATHEMATICS

This month students who are currently enrolled in a **Grade 9 Applied or Academic mathematics** courses will take the province wide standardized Grade 9 Math test. This mandatory assessment of mathematics will involve multiple choice and extended response questions. This assessment will be administered over two of the students' regular mathematics classes. The dates for this test at Holy Cross are **Wednesday June**, 11<sup>th</sup> and **Thursday**, **June** 12<sup>th</sup>. A student's performance on this EQAO assessment is worth 10% of his or her final mark.

#### 2008 HOLY CROSS YEARBOOK

The 2008 Holy Cross Crusade was distributed on May 26<sup>th</sup>, 2008. Thanks to both Mr. Prior's Period 1 and 2 classes and the yearbook staff who coordinated the distribution process. Some students have not yet picked up their personalized copies. If you have not yet picked up your pre-purchased copy (included in your September student fee), please see Mr. Prior in Room 129 during periods 1 or 2, or during the lunch hour. If you have a friend that you know is no longer at Holy Cross, you may also pick up their copy for them. We regret that there are no additional copies available.

#### Locker Clean-up and Clean-Out Procedures

Senior students must clear and clean their locker of personal belongings on the day of their final examination or at the latest before the end of the day on **Monday**, **June 16**<sup>th</sup>. Junior students must clear and clean their locker of personal belongings on the day of their final examination or at the latest before the end of the day on **Friday**, **June 20**<sup>th</sup>. In the last week of June, locks will be seized and lockers will be cleared of all contents with items being donated.

Writing on locker doors or any part of the locker is considered defacement of school property. Any writing, tape, posters, shelves or mirrors must be removed by the student from the locker by the dates posted. Students are asked to leave their locker in a better condition than they found it. Students should place notepaper and unwanted notebooks in the recycling bins and school supplies may be placed in the appropriate containers for re-distribution and use by those in need.

June Textbook Returns: Textbooks issued by Holy Cross are the property of the school and are on loan to a student on a semester basis only. Happily, the vast majority of students are responsible users of their textbooks. Nonetheless, at this time of year it is well to remind all users of school policy. Books are costly to replace/repair and are sometimes unavailable for purchase. Students are reminded that it is their responsibility to care for their books and to return all items in good condition. Mixups can occur in classrooms, and a student may inadvertently have another person's textbook in his/her possession. Students are responsible for returning the textbooks assigned to them. Please search your house, car, locker, etc. for any textbooks which may not have been returned. The school needs these missing copies.

HC textbooks are due back on the day of the individual student's final exam. Students are to personally return the textbooks they were issued to the Textbook Room or to the Library, to ensure that their account is cleared. Textbooks left in the classroom or exam room remain the student's responsibility.

The \$100. deposit cheques will be cashed for unreturned or damaged books beginning **June 27<sup>th</sup>.** After that date no information or refunds will be available until school starts in September. If there are any questions about textbooks, please call Mr. Mario Cortis or Miss Mary Pryal at extension 3413, before June 22.

<u>August Textbook Pick-Up:</u> Students will be able to pick up their next year's first semester textbooks as of the last week in August. The textbook room will be open on **Monday**, **August 25<sup>th</sup> to Thursday**, **August 28<sup>th</sup>** from **9am to 3pm**. It will also be open in the evening of **Tuesday**, **August 26<sup>th</sup>** from **6pm to 9pm**. **Monday**, **August 25<sup>th</sup>** is reserved as a "grade **9 only"** day. Only the new grade **9 students** will be served on that day. Other students can pick up their books on any of the other days.

In order to get textbooks each student's account of the previous year must be clear. Student must have their green textbook card to be validated. (New grade 9 students will be given their cards at textbook pickup time.) A separate textbook deposit cheque must be submitted. This cheque is to be made out to Holy Cross Secondary School, in the amount of \$100, postdated to  $March\ 1^{st},\ 2009$ , and should have the student's full name printed at the top left of the cheque.

Please be advised that any textbook account problems that have not been resolved from the previous semester will not be able to be addressed during the busy textbook pick-up days. Replacement green textbook cards are \$5.00 and cannot be issued the same day. In order to avoid delays please ensure that all textbooks are returned on time and that lost textbook cards are replaced before the end of June.

### Carleton University - Enriched Support Program

The ESP is a full-time program that helps students qualify for university admission while earning first-year university credits. ESP students take three first-year university courses, receive academic support in weekly workshops and are guaranteed admission to a degree if they earn the required average (C+ for most programs) in their ESP year. Applications are due by June 15. Check the site carleton.ca/esp

Student timetables for the 2008-2009 school year will be issued this week. Students are asked to connect with Student Services as soon as possible to deal with any necessary changes. It is the intent of Student Services to have timetable problems/changes resolved by the end of exams. Students who intend to switch from applied courses (English/Science) in Grade 9 to academic in Grade 10 are reminded that completion of a "crossover material" package is strongly recommended (switching from applied to academic Math involves summer school). Please see your counsellor for details. Senior students are required to complete a "half credit" transfer course (Summer School) in order to switch from applied to university/college (English/Math/Science).

# Summer School Information

Summer School will operate at Regiopolis-Notre Dame Catholic Secondary School this summer beginning on July 2<sup>rd</sup> and concluding on July 25<sup>th</sup>. Summer school is operated by the two Boards of Education in the Kingston Area: Limestone and our own Algonquin and Lakeshore Catholic District School Board. Further information regarding Summer school is available in Student Services. Students may choose to take courses to improve on a mark already achieved or enroll in a new credit course. Summer school applications are available now in Student Services. Students must see their courselor to obtain this information.

#### COURSE RECONCILIATION DAYS

Course reconciliation days are established in order to provide students with an opportunity to complete independent study assignments, culminating assessments and to complete any credit rescue work that needs to be submitted in order to provide evidence that the course expectations have been achieved.

In addition, students are encouraged to meet with their teachers to review their strengths, any areas requiring improvement, and the corresponding next steps. This day is a regular instructional day which is designed to assist students by providing them with the time to meet individually with their teachers to discuss their progress over the course of the semester. We hope that this opportunity will provide students with additional information in order to assist them with course and/or program selection for next year.
