

HC Tech Has Got Skill





Congratulations to HC Technological Education students for their medal winning performances in the 2019 Loyalist College Skills Competition on Tuesday, February 26^{th.}

In the Carpentry (Team of 2) category Rachael Callery & Michael Soudant won the Gold Medal, and Laura McLaren & Ethan Joe won the Bronze Medal. The students had to read blueprints, cut wood, and assemble an outdoor two seater patio rocking chair in 4 hours.
