NCC Guidance



All grade 9-11 students are reminded to have their course selections sheets completed and signed by a parent. Grade 8 students should have their registration packages submitted to their teacher.


IB @ NCC

OSSLT—Literacy Test —Grade 10 Students



The OSSLT measures whether students are meeting the minimum standard for literacy across all subjects up to the end of Grade 9. Successful completion of the literacy test is one of the requirements to earn an Ontario Secondary School Diploma. All students across the province write this test.

Catholic Education Designation

Protect and promote Catholic education...Ensure you are registered to vote as a Catholic separate school supporter

Ensuring you are registered as a separate school supporter is important for the protection and preservation of Catholic education in Ontario. As a registered Catholic school supporter, you have the opportunity to elect trustees who will represent and address your interests and concerns at the school board level and at various levels of the government.

Registering your Catholic school support ensures your school board's assessment roll is accurate. This is important because:

- Your school board's assessment base is a public record of the breadth of support for Catholic schools;
- It helps track demographic trends for educational planning purposes;
- It guarantees your right to enroll your children in Catholic schools.

Vacations and Absences

Although **trips** and **vacations** may provide diverse learning experiences, the school does not support, academically, travel or vacations during class time. The Education Act is explicit when explaining school attendance and the legitimate reasons for school absence. Students may be absent from school because they are ill, other unavoidable causes, celebrating a religious holiday or receiving music instruction. Extended vacations are not included in these reasons. Therefore, while parents/guardians may choose to travel during the school year, the time missed from class is recorded as an absence and counted in the total absence record for the semester. A significant number of absences place a student's education in jeopardy due to the loss of instructional time and assessment and evaluation becomes problematic. Nicholson Catholic College teachers will not be responsible for producing work assignments or providing make-up assignments or tests for students on vacation.

Students who will be away for an extended period for vacation should submit their information in writing to Mr. Stuart (stuartg@alcdsb.on.ca)

Students are responsible for all course work and assignments while absent. When a test is missed due to illness, a note from a parent/guardian acknowledging his/her awareness that a test has been missed, due to illness, is required. If a pattern of absence for assessments is noted by teachers, a doctor's note may also be required at the discretion of the administration. When missing an examination due to illness, a doctor's note is always required. Any test missed due to vacation or truancy will not be rescheduled and will be assigned a mark of incomplete (I) as this summative assessment must demonstrate evidence that course expectations have been met with success.

Parking and Drop Off/Pick Up

John St. Parking/Drop Off

Morning

- We ask that traffic only travel on the West side of the street (school side) so that students do not have to cross the street through traffic.
- Please drop your child off, and allow them to walk into the gate.



Afternoon:

 Again we ask that families only park on the West side of the street so children do not have cross between cars.

Church St. Parking Lot

Morning:

- Our Crossing Guard Sandra will continue to direct traffic and keep your children safe as they cross the street. We ask families to please respect her role and pay attention to her direction and the stop sign that she holds up. All too often people are going through her stop sign and putting your children at risk.
- Please pull into the parking lot either on the lower end on Victoria street (bottom of the hill) or the furthest south entrance. We will be trying to keep most traffic away from the center laneway where children cross.
- You may accompany your children to the crossing guard, but then leave them and we will welcome them on the other side of the street.
- Families <u>SHOULD NOT</u> drop children off in the bus lane. We have buses coming right up until 8:15am and we risk an accident in the bus loading zone at the front of the school (This is a designated bus loading zone, and no stopping zone. By Law Officers may enforce this)
- If you are exiting the middle lane of the church parking lot, please only turn right, to avoid going through the cross walk.

Afternoon:

- Please park in the lot and wait on the church side of the street. Your children will come to you.
- We ask that if you are exiting the middle laneway, you only turn right out of the center laneway to avoid the cross walk.
- Please avoid the bus laneway and pay close attention to our crossing guard and her direction.

We thank you for your understanding and patience with these protocols, as we do our absolute best to ensure student safety. We know this may cause inconvenience or delay however we will never put convenience ahead of student safety.

Attendance on SNOW DAYS

When Triboard cancels <u>ALL</u> busses – All students will be signed out due to weather and those attending school will sign in at the main office to be marked present.

When Triboard cancels **SOME** busses, only those students bussed will be marked out due to bus cancellation. For students not attending school, parents are asked to report this through the School Messenger system at 1-844-445-4383 or via the School Messenger App.

Safe Arrivals Program

Report your Child's Absence









The Algonquin and Lakeshore Catholic District School Board is excited to launch the Safe Arrivals Program on February 1, 2020, which will allow parents/guardians to report their child's absence in a new, more convenient way.

Using the Safe Arrivals Program, parents/guardians will be able to report daily absences (such as an illness, medical appointment, etc.) and even schedule absences in one of three ways:

- SchoolMessenger mobile app
- SchoolMessenger website
- Calling toll-free 1-844-445-4383

Once parents/guardians have reported an absence, they will receive a message confirming the details by email or the app, if set up.

As student safety is ALCDSB's number one priority, this program allows school secretaries to know where students are faster and track their absences in a more effective way.

Before you begin, you must have an email address and/or phone number associated with your child's school to sign up.




