

### **School Cash Online**

Our school is a "cashless school". If you haven't already, please register for SchoolCashOnline by simply going to the Board or School website and following the prompts. All payments for milk, pizza, hot dog lunches fieldtrips, etc, will be paid for online. You can pay for items a month at a time if you wish. If you do not have access to the Internet or are not set up for online banking the school will still accept cheques/cash but do not send money with your child. Please come into the office and Mrs. Berthelot will accept payment directly from you.

### **Safe Arrival Program**

Parents/guardians are asked to call the school at **613-962-2162** whenever your child will be late or absent. A message may be left at any time on the answering machine. Please indicate your child's name, grade and teacher as well as your name. If no message is received, office staff will use the contact information provided to speak with the parent or guardian regarding the child's absence.



### Signing In and Signing Out

A binder is in the office for parents/guardians to sign in their child when they arrive late and sign out when they pick up their child early. **Please do not take your child off the school yard.** Staff will call your child to the office to meet you.



<u>Changes in After School Routine</u> Any changes in your child's regular bus or pick up routine should be relayed to the office at least a day in advance when possible. If last minute changes are required, please call the school before 1:00p.m. to ensure the message gets to your child. <u>Please do not leave a message on the answering machine regarding changes in your child's end of day routine.</u>



### **Lunch Hour**

All students are expected to stay at school throughout the lunch hour unless signed out by a parent/guardian.



This year we will continue to offer Little Caesar's pizza as an option on Thursdays for \$3.00. In addition to Thursday Pizza we will also be offering Hot Dog Tuesdays. To meet the criteria of the School Food and Beverage Policy only weiners that meet this criteria will be purchased along with whole wheat buns. Ketchup will be the only condiment offered. ### **Safety Drills**

Over the next few weeks, classes will be practicing fire drills and lockdown drills. These drills will be conducted in a positive manner as staff are well trained to include only necessary and age appropriate information.

### Medication

It is important that the school is aware if your child has a severe medical condition. School staff may only administer medication to students with written authorization from the parent/guardian **and** the prescribing physician. Please contact the school to discuss your

child's medical condition and to obtain the Medical Information and Consent forms. All medications must be clearly labelled.

### **Anaphylaxis**

We have several students in our school with life threatening allergies to nuts & peanuts. Eating or touching nuts, peanuts, & food containing nuts & peanuts can result in death in a matter of minutes.

As parents, we all understand the intense concern anaphylaxis can cause. As a school community we will work together to reduce the possibility of exposure to allergens at school. Please continue to pack snack and lunch items that **do not contain nuts, peanuts, or nut products**. Should your child inadvertently bring one of these items, he/she will be asked to leave it in his/her lunch box and an alternate snack will be offered.

### **Electronic Devices**

It is preferable that all **Electronic Devices be left at home**. Should our Intermediate Classes (Grade 6, 7 and 8) choose to make personal electronic devices part of their program, teachers will do explicit teaching around how to use these devices responsibly in a school setting; this unit is called Responsible Digital Citizenship. **These items are not necessary for learning** as classes are fitted with iPads and laptops. Students will have access to the school phone in the event of an emergency.



### **Picture Day**

Students from Kindergarten to grade 8 will have their individual and class pictures taken on **Tuesday September 24**<sup>th</sup>.



### **PA Day**
