Reminder for Students Applying to University

The deadline for Ontario secondary school students to submit completed online applications to OUAC (Ontario University Application Centre) is **January 15th**, **2020**. Because of the high volume of applications received prior to this date, RND students are strongly encouraged to complete their application prior to the Christmas Holidays.

Students are encouraged to make an appointment with their guidance counselor if they need any further assistance with their application. Students must pick up their OUAC PIN in Student Services in order to apply.

Students applying to out-of-province universities must inform **Mrs. Warren** before final exams so deadlines for transcripts can by met.

Reminder for Students Applying to College

Applications received and paid for on or before **February 1**st, **2020** will be given equal consideration by the colleges. Because of the high volume of applications received each year, RND students are strongly encouraged to complete their application prior to the Christmas Holidays. After **February 1**st, **2020**, applications are still processed but will be considered by the colleges on a first-come, first-served basis. It is unlikely that an application for a highly competitive program to be considered after the deadline.


