Principal's Message

With semester two well underway at Regiopolis-Notre Dame, we are in the season of Lent, a time for reflection and preparation for Easter, a time of prayer, fasting and almsgiving. This year, our Share Lent campaign will be raising funds for Saint Vincent DePaul Society.

Perhaps our upcoming April break will be a time to enjoy the change of season and to recharge for the remainder of the semester. The move from a March to April break represents yet another change this year, but despite all the changes and challenges, the students, staff and parents of RND have worked hard to maintain a sense of normalcy. I express my appreciation to all students and staff for their continuing contributions to making RND continue to feel like a community of learners. Our school is blessed to have so many dedicated and talented members who share their time and talents with one another. I would like to congratulate the RND Student Council for all their work in organizing a number of school wide activities including a school-wide Kahoot Challenge, Valentine's Virtual Coffee House, and Spirit Week to name just a few. ALCDSB's student information system known as Maplewood was recently switched over to ASPEN mid February. As you can image, the migration of student data from one system to another is very complex. We ask for your patience and understanding as teachers and office staff work through the changeover, correcting data errors and familiarizing themselves with the system.

In preparation for the upcoming OSSLT field-test (Octomester 7), our literacy preparation program is underway. All grade 10, 11, and returning grade 12 students in Octomester 5 will complete a practice OSSLT to familiarize them with the new online version of the test. During Octomester 6, eligible students will be working through OSSLT sample questions. Information for eligible writers will be sent home and updates will be communicated as we get closer to the date.

Students are reminded to continue to be stewards of our school environment by picking up after themselves, maintaining and wearing uniforms properly, and being respectful of one another and of themselves. Once again, I ask students and parents to follow all health unit protocols, complete the COVID screener daily, socially distance especially in the bathrooms, wear facemasks properly while on school property and sanitize hands frequently.

I wish you all continued success as Octomester 5 comes to an end and Octomester 6 begins.

Student Services

OUAC and OCAS Applications

Students are reminded to check the accuracy of the information contained in their OUAC and/or OCAS accounts. Be certain to adhere to all deadlines established by the schools to which they have applied. Many college programs remain open for student applications. Some university programs do accept applications after the OUAC deadline; however, it is the student's responsibility to contact Admissions of the school in question.

Online Course Selection for 2021/22

In early February guidance counsellors began the course selection process for next year with grade nines and tens. Counsellors will continue with grade elevens then Remote Learners prior to March Break. Once again students are using myBlueprint to choose their courses; this online planner is accessed through their Virtual Common and can be viewed from home. Parents should discuss course plans with their children. Students should not Review nor Submit courses without parent/guardian approval. Guidance counselors are available to answer any questions or concerns.

Grade 12 Returning Students

Once gr 9 to 11 course selection is complete, guidance counsellors will visit grade 12 homerooms to explain the process to Return for September 2021.

Any students who are eligible to graduate this year but intend to return to RND must complete an "Intent to Return" form. This form will soon be available in Student Services. Students must create a plan with their guidance counsellor then must meet with our principal, **Mr. Melim**, for approval. Only then can Returners complete course selection for the 2021-22 school year. Forms signed by **Mr. Melim** must be returned to Student Services, and students will be re-activated at that time.

Dual Credit Program at RND with SLC

Grade 12 and returning students at RND have an opportunity to earn college credits while attending high school. Dual credit programs are Ministry-approved programs that allow students, while they are still in secondary school, to take college or apprenticeship courses that count towards both the Ontario Secondary School Diploma (OSSD) and a postsecondary certificate, diploma, or degree, or an apprenticeship certification. Virtual Discovery Day in Health Sciences at Queen's

You're invited to participate in the virtual *Discovery Day in Health Sciences* event, hosted by Queen's University on Wednesday, **May 19th**. Meet us online to explore careers in medicine and the health sciences.

Our modified virtual ½-day program will be hosted on the event platform Accelevents and includes exhibits, a keynote lecture, an interactive workshop of choice and a career panel discussion. Although our delivery model has been adapted temporarily, the program is still considered an *individual learning opportunity*. As usual, this event will be for **grade 10 and 11 students** interested in sciences.

Volunteer Hours for Potential Grads

Grade 12s who are set to graduate at the end of this year must complete a minimum of 20 hours community service to do so. Since it is an unusual year with Covid-19 Protocols in place, what constitutes an acceptable volunteer opportunity has become more flexible this year. When in doubt, see your guidance counsellor for approval of volunteer experiences. Please submit completed Volunteer forms to Student Service as soon as possible.

Volunteer Opportunity – SQUASH

SQUASH (Students at Queen's Urban Agriculture Hub) and other eco-focused campus groups are looking to expand a system of native pollinator and other gardens on Queen's University campus. They are looking for students from the Kingston area throughout the summer months (May to August) to assist in basic upkeep duties in exchange for volunteer hours. Work would primarily be manual, but not strenuous, labour on Queen's Campus. Fresh air, tools provided, and distanced (COVID-safe!), honest work.

Learning opportunities include integrating knowledge of wildscaping, permaculture, and xeriscaping principles into urban gardens. Resources, visual guides and general leadership would be provided to ensure success. For more information, students should contact squash@clubs.queensu.ca

Poetry Contest



- 1) As course selection for **September 2021** is underway, IB students should see **Mr. David** in the IB Office to discuss IB Pathways and Choices to ensure all IB requirements are being met. Students/parents may also email questions to: david@alcdsb.on.ca.
- 2) **eCoursework upload deadline is March 2**nd. This deadline date includes Extended Essays, TOK Essay, and English A: Literature Higher Level Essay. Students are reminded to check with their EE supervisor, TOK teacher, and IB Coordinator to ensure formatting and upload requirements.
- 3) Year 1 and Year 2 IB students are reminded that all IAs are externally assessed this year, not internally assessed. **Upload date is April 6th, 2021**. Individual subject tearchers are responsible for uploading student work.
- 4) The International Baccalaureate Organization has designated our school as an "exam route" school which means that May exams are proceeding with modifications. This year exams will take place onsite at Regi. The exact location is yet to be determined. All government and Public Health recommendations for the prevention of COVID 19 will be adhered to throughout the examination session.
- 5) Thank you to all grade 8 students who applied to the IB Preparation Programme for **September 2021**. We look forward to your participation in the IB Programme at RND! Applications to the IB Prep Programme are still being accepted, although spots are limited at this time.
